Did You Know?

Men with an elevated PSA level (between 4 and 10) have a 1 in 4 chance of having prostate cancer. Men with a PSA less than 4 have a 1 in 7 chance of prostate cancer.¹

Although PSA is a widely used screening tool, it has known limitations. An elevated PSA level may be a warning sign for prostate cancer, however, there are other common, non-cancerous causes for an elevated PSA level such as benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH), prostatitis, inflammation, urinary tract infection, prostate stimulation (e.g. bike riding, sexual activity), and age.¹

Select mdx is a simple urine test

If you have an elevated PSA level, Select mdx will help you and your doctor decide whether or not you should have a prostate biopsy procedure.

By providing a routine urine sample at your next doctor appointment, the test indicates your personal risk for prostate cancer.

- Low risk men may avoid a potentially unnecessary invasive biopsy procedure.
- Elevated risk men may benefit from a prostate biopsy or MRI.

Why do I need Select mdx?

The Select mdx test will assess your risk for prostate cancer. By providing the cancer-specific information that PSA lacks, your Select mdx test results will help determine if you need a biopsy. The test is recommended by leading urologists and included in the National Comprehensive Cancer Network Guidelines.²

Select mdx can provide your provider with actionable information that helps:

- Confidently rule out the need for an invasive prostate biopsy procedure for men at a low risk, therefore also avoiding the possible complications that can arise from this procedure (bleeding, infection, sepsis, urinary symptoms, and sexual dysfunction).
- Determine if you are at increased risk for prostate cancer. Your provider may suggest a biopsy which may improve your chances for early detection and give you more treatment choices.

Will my insurance cover Select mdx?

Where can I get the Select mdx test?

Ask your provider about getting the Select mdx test. They can collect a urine sample on your next office visit and send it for testing.
